

(ii) LPNs applying from other Canadian Jurisdictions

Applicants licensed as LPNs/RPNs from other provinces who wish to apply for licensure in Newfoundland and Labrador are required to complete the **Credential Assessment** process to determine eligibility.

All Licensed Practical Nurses in Newfoundland and Labrador must have education in IV Therapy, Medication Administration, Blood and Blood Products, and Health Assessment.

Applicants must:

- Complete the <u>Credential Assessment Application for LPNs Registered within</u> Canada.
- Pay the Credential Assessment fee (See Registration and Services Fees Policy);
- Complete Form B (Verification of Registration) Complete Section A of Form B and send a copy to all licensing boards where you have been licensed in the last 5 years. They will complete and send it directly to the CLPNNL.
- Submit:
- Copy of birth certificate
- Copy of marriage certificate (if applicable)
- Copy of government-issued picture identification (color copy)
- Applicants whose first language is not English and whose English proficiency
 was not assessed by another Canadian jurisdiction should
 submit <u>IELTS or CELBAN</u> language score. The CLPNNL <u>English Language</u>
 <u>Proficiency Policy</u> is located in section E.

If deemed eligible to apply for licensure in this province, applicants will be provided instructions regarding fees and additional requirements. While each situation is unique, the credential assessment process generally takes 2 - 4 weeks to complete.

Once deemed eligible for licensure in Newfoundland and Labrador, the applicant will be required to:

- Provide an **Original** Criminal Record Check, including Vulnerable Sector Screen, not older than six (6) months before the date the license is to be processed. CLPNNL will accept a verified electronic version from the source.
- o Pay the Initial licensure fee.
- Complete the required <u>Jurisprudence</u> module provided free of charge through the Newfoundland and Labrador Provincial Continuing Education Portal.
- Submit the *certificate of successful completion* of Jurisprudence module.

When all fees and required documents have been received and deemed satisfactory, the license will be processed, and when a temporary license to practice is issued, the LPN will receive an e-mail containing their receipt/certification of licensure and the LPN's name will be found on the FIND A NURSE section on the CLPNNL website.
